You are invited to an exhibit of quilts by **Betty Whitman**, between July 25 and August 5, at Cabrillo Sewing Center. The store, located at 1475-41st Avenue, in Capitola is open from 10-6 Monday through Saturday, 11-5 Sunday.

On Saturday, July 29 from 2-4 Betty will present a trunk show of her favorite quilts. Everyone is welcome at the trunk show, and refreshments will be offered. She has been quilting since 1971. Betty learned to quilt from her mother; her grandmother was a quilt piecer: so she is a third generation quilter

There will also be an exhibit by local fiber embellishment artist and art quilter **Rosemary Eichorn**, between August 18 and 26, at Cabrillo Sewing Center

Rosemary's book, "The Art of Fabric Collage," is in its 3rd printing. Many quilters have expanded the techniques they use in quilting from Rosemary's book, her website, and from her classes.

Sylvia Einstein – Divide and Conquer

Saturday & Sunday, August 5 & 6; 10-4

Monterey Peninsula College, Family & Consumer Science Building

You own one or several fascinating pieces of fabric that captivate you. We'll cut them apart and insert strips so the fabric becomes background yet maintains its identity. I have made trees, letterforms or just abstract linear designs with this technique. You'll discover other possibilities while working intuitively and developing your own quilt. Sylvia Phippen – Sashiko Workshop

Sunday, September 10; 10-4

Monterey Peninsula College, Family & Consumer Science Building



Sashiko is a traditional Japanese embellishment using a running stitch of heavy white cotton on indigo fabric. In this workshop you will learn sashiko techniques and applications while working on a Japanese family crest or other design. Learn to easily transfer designs onto dark or light fabric, how to use different fabric and threads for Sashiko, and techniques for perfect stitch length, curves and corners.

Applications for Sashiko will be demonstrated: geometric sashiko and family crest designs, Sashiko combined with appliqué or pieced quilts, and quilting with sashiko patterns. Small projects using sashiko will be on display. <http://www.sylviapippendesigns.com/>

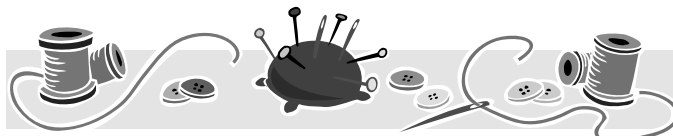
