*MPQG* received a generous donation of fabric and quilting/sewing supplies from the family of *Martha Wilcox* (1936-2022). Martha grew up in San Jose and completed her nursing degree at Stanford. A self-taught quilter, Martha and her husband moved to the Monterey Peninsula. Martha joined the Salvation Army's SAFE Adult Day Care Program in their Alzheimer's unit where she volunteered as an ombudsman for 20 years and described herself as "an old public health nurse and an advocate for the elderly in long-term care." Her hands were wonderful and unique kits full of perfectly curated fabrics! The sale will be located in the rooms at the back of Chautauqua Hall and on Saturday and Sunday will spill out to the front porch. As kits are sold, more of Martha's treasures will be put on display, so think about returning almost hourly throughout the weekend.

*Christ Child Society of Monterey County* benefits from any size baby, crib, or toddler quilt. Extras include: burp cloths, changing table pads, lovies, etc. The ladies at St. Angela's create color coordinated layettes that use our quilts along with hats, booties, and small teddy bears that their members crochet or knit.

For needed extras, think about whipping up a few log cabin blocks. Two would make a good burb cloth, and three or four slightly larger blocks would be perfect for a changing table pad. (We know that you have plenty of fabric strips and left-over batting.) They are a perfect nonproject for the days when you just feel like sewing something easy.

- underwater fish, coral or kelp
- diving expeditions in any location
- any underwater scene you can imagine!
