

based on the Rand McNally Thomas Guide Book of maps. Each piece in the series represents a coastal area of LA County. Her work is part of a permanent installation at Harbor UCLA Medical Center in Southern California, the Western Museum of Flight, The Monday Club of San Luis Obispo and Crafted at Port of LA.

She received a BFA in Illustration from the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena CA.



"I create my art by pulling from images and ideas that resonate with me personally: locations with which I am familiar; places I would like to visit; moments in history; and social causes and topics. The subject and intent of the piece guides the

selection of the material I use, including textiles acquired from many sources, fabric I dye or print myself, and my own photographs edited and printed on fabric. In my work, materials help tell the story, and prompt the viewer to deeper and more reflective exploration."

Jogakbo with Ssamsol Technique

Workshop with Youngmin Lee

Saturday, September 16, 2023 1pm to 4pm via **ZOOM**

Youngmin Lee is Korean-born with a master's degree in fashion design and bachelor's in clothing and textiles. In this class she will be teaching the Korean art of patchwork Jogakbo with the Ssmasol technique.

Patchwork bojagi, or **Jogakbo**, are used as Korean wrapping cloths and used in everyday Korean culture. With thoughtfully arranged shapes and colors in bojagi create a modern and abstract composition.

Ssamsol is a durable and decorative seam technique where you use two different seam allowances. One seam allowance is twice the width of the other one, so it can cover the smaller seam allowance. (Think French seams.)

Using this Ssamsol technique, Youngmin will teach 'Ssamsol Jogakbo' construction to create your own unique piece.

A material kit will be available to purchase from Youngmin at the September 11 guild meeting (\$30) or from her website (+\$5 for shipping) www.youngminlee.com. Kit includes assorted fabric pieces, thread, needle and PDF instruction.

Community Outreach

Willing to make quilt tops? Willing to quilt and bind the tops? You can do the part of the quilting you like the most such as sewing quilt blocks, sewing quilt blocks together to make tops, domestic or long arm machine quilting or sewing on binding. You do not need to make an entire quilt as we provide batting, backing and binding to make a quilt. The Community Outreach team are making up very simple kits for members to pick up, make and then return at one of our in-person guild meeting, one of the guild's Friendship Groups or by contacting a team member for pickup. These quilts which are made by guild members are then distributed to one of our 'in need' individuals or groups.



Here are some recommendations for sizes (see MPQG website under the <u>Community Outreach</u> link). You don't need to make rectangular quilts; they can be square and you can certainly vary the size. Just keep in mind that the purpose is to keep people warm and brighten their day!

* Twin: 70 x 90 inches

* Lap/Wheelchair: 32 x 40inches or 36 x 36 inches

* Throw: 50 x 65 inches

See you at our August meeting to pick up one of the many finishing quilt kits, turn in completed quilt tops and return finished Community Quilts!



Block of the Month – August 2023



WEATHERVANE

The August block was found in Best Blocks by "Quilters Newsletter".

<u>Best Blocks</u> informs us that "Ruby McKim included this lovely old block pattern in One Hundred and One Patchwork Patterns and claimed that it dated back to the time when Great Grandmother had to rely on her weathervane, rather than listening to the reliable scientific forecast we enjoy today."

Weathervanes or wind vanes have been around since ancient times. It is believed that the first weathervane was built in about 48 B.C. by the Greek astronomer Andronicus for the Tower of the Winds in Athens.

Because knowing the wind speed and wind direction is a vital clue to the weather, the weathervane had an important place in keeping quilters and their loved ones safe. Long ago a quilter honored the Weathervane with its own block and our Block for August.

The Weathervane block is a charmer. Think garden party, placemats, table runner or a child's quilt. The block is fast and easy. By pre-cutting fabric, chain piecing can be used on the entire block to make assembly a breeze. Using only squares and half-square triangles (HSTs), this block can be foundation paper pieced (FPP) or simply pieced in a jiffy. Try putting four together and a secondary design appears.

I hope you will join the fun.

2023 Quilt Challenge

ALPHABET SOUP

18" x 18"

3 layers (top, batting and backing), a sleeve for hanging and a label*.

Quilt must contain one letter of the alphabet, big or small.

Any style, technique, or color you want.

Your quilt should represent one of the 26 letters of the alphabet. Some ideas include:

- Choosing a traditional or modern quilt block that begins in the letter of choice (i.e., B = Bear's Paw, Basket, etc.)
 - Embellishing quilt with things pertaining to the letter of choice (i.e., B= buttons, beads, etc.)
 - Appliquéing animals or objects onto the block (i.e., B=bear, butterfly, etc.)
 - Foundation paper piece the letter of choice
 - A combination of all the above.

We hope you will participate in this year's challenge, it's so much fun to see how creative a group we are.
