Joy-Lily Dyeing to Tell You

Joy Lily describes herself as follows: "My art falls into the category "surface design." I am a silk painter, dyer, quilt maker and fabric printer. My choices of



imagery come from my deep respect for, and fascination with the natural world. I am continually surprised and delighted by the astonishing variety, beauty and fecundity of life around us. Shells, flowers and leaves offer endless choices of colors and forms to celebrate. I want to remind my viewers that our precious and diminishing ecosystems are also beautiful."

Joy Lily's work has been exhibited in New York, Washington DC, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Santa Fe, Hannover Germany and Beijing. For 11 years she was artist-in-residence, through the California Arts Council, at 30th Street Senior Center in San Francisco, working with elders in textile media. She currently teaches fiber arts through adult education and through quilt and art guilds believing that we are all born artists but often this creatively was stifled at an early age.

This lecture is a lively and informative slide talk about dyes and colors and Joy Lily's art career. She will be sharing via slides her wearable art, silk paintings, batiks and quilt art, plus diagrams demystifying how eyes work and how colors blend. Learn which dyes work best, and which to avoid, how to dye in your washing machine, how to use dyes safely and much more. Find more info at joy-lily.com

Quilt Show Acceptance letters and Quilt Label/Show Card Information Sheets

The Quilt Show Acceptance Letters with the Quilt Label/Show Card Information sheets were mailed out early April so if you haven't received your letter contact me IMMEDIATELY. If you have not already done so, READ the Acceptance Letter and CHECK the Show Card Information for any errors. Cut off the upper section titled "Quilt Label" and sew it to the back of your quilt as directed. Instructions for making and sewing a sleeve to your quilt are also included. The bottom half, titled "Show Card Information", contains the information that I print on a card that will hang next to your quilt in the show. Please proofread it carefully and report any errors to me ASAP, as I need to begin printing the cards this week.

Bring your quilts to Chautauqua Hall on Thursday, May 4, between 7:00 AM and 9:30 AM. Judged quilts MUST arrive by 8:30AM or they WILL NOT be judged. Contact me if you have any questions. Block of the Month – May 2023

Skyrocket

The Skyrocket block was created by Ruby McKim and first published in 1931. Perhaps Ruby was inspired by the 1931 official adoption of the Star-Spangled Banner. Beginning in ancient China, through wars and celebrations, skyrockets have been around for a very long time. In modern times, skyrockets conjure thoughts of outer space and new frontiers. Who can forget that in 1976, the Starland Vocal Band gave us a new meaning for "skyrockets in flight".



Ruby's version, our block, shows sharp, thin points, which could be quite challenging. FPP makes those skinny points a "piece of cake" to accomplish. Ruby printed a paper piecing pattern which involved multiple Y joints. Reworked to eliminate the Y joints, our block has just two simple pattern pieces, each repeated four times. No Y seams and some opportunity for string piecing.

Put four Skyrocket blocks together to find a secondary star. Play with the lights and darks to get significantly different and beautiful effects. Try batiks for an entirely new and more modern look.

This method of practicing improv within the block and then squaring it up for final construction allows room for a lot of play and exploration both in color and form. We will also discuss how color

placement and value can create high impact compositions that move the eye across the quilt.

I was contacted by Quinn Junghans, Volunteer Coordinator for the VNA Hospice of the Central Coast and they need to distribute wheelchair lap quilts to their patients to keep them warm, cozy, feel special and most of all loved. Wheelchair lap quilts are the perfect leg warmer for anyone who is in a wheelchair or who likes to be cozy while sitting in a chair. Finished size is a smaller version of a traditional throw size quilt in both width and length. For many hospice or nursing home residents, these quilts give comfort and constantly remind them that someone cares about them. These gifts also serve as a keepsake for the family members as well.


The Pillow Projects

ALPHABET SOUP

18" x 18"

3 layers (top, batting and backing), a sleeve for hanging and a label*. Quilt must contain one letter of the alphabet, big or small. Any style, technique, or color you want.

Your quilt should represent one of the 26 letters of the alphabet. Some ideas include:

 Choosing a traditional or modern quilt block that begins in the letter of choice (i.e., B = Bear's Paw, Basket, etc.)

- Embellishing quilt with things pertaining to the letter of choice (i.e., B= buttons, beads, etc.)
- Appliquéing animals or objects onto the block (i.e., B=bear, butterfly, etc.)
 - Foundation paper piece the letter of choice
 - A combination of all the above.

We hope you will participate in this year's challenge, it's so much fun to see how creative a group we are.

The quilts will be due at our guild meeting on Aug 1, 2023.
