The August meeting is also the time to turn in your Guild Challenge and your block of the month. I'm patting myself on the back for finishing both!

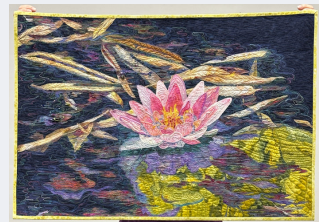

The De-stash Project has been another fun project to get the whole guild involved. I am sure the new Activities Coordinator will bring new energy and ideas to the position. Thank you again for your enthusiasm and participation.

UFO Challenge

Our UFO Challenge this year has been another success. As of mid-July, we have finished 110 projects since September 2025, with 17 being donated to Community Outreach. Kelly Monroe won last month's prize: a queen-size package of Warm and Natural batting. Congratulations, Kelly!

The UFO Challenge ends August 3! For the August Mini Challenge, the random number is 13. To participate in the Mini Challenge, finish project number 13 on your list(s) by the August 3, 2026, meeting. Email a photograph of your finished project to Laura Lawrence before the meeting or bring it in person for Show and Tell. You will earn 3 bonus tickets for finishing.

500 Yard De-stash

We have surpassed our goal of de-stashing 500 yards of fabric and batting! Great work! We are still accepting squares of fabric through the end of September. Let's see how many more yards you can de-stash. If we could de-stash another 55 yards, we would have enough squares to make one more tummy time quilt.

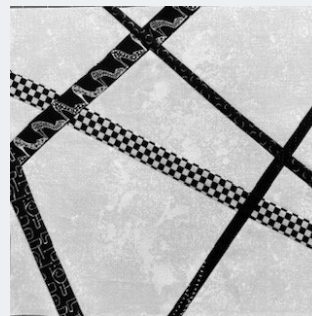
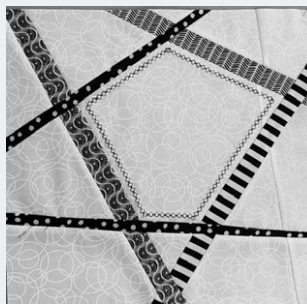
For every yard of fabric and batting used from your stash for a project, donate a 2 ½ inch square of fabric—preferably fabric used in the project. These 2 ½ inch squares will be used to make Community Outreach Quilts. We have made 2 tummy time quilt tops and one incubator quilt top so far.

No sign up is required. Simply submit photos of your finished projects to Alisa Boehme (alisaboehme@hotmail.com) or Karen Shaffer (karendshaffer@aol.com) and report on the total number of yards used from fabric and batting you already have on hand (rounded up to the nearest yard). Turn in a 2 ½ inch square of fabric for each yard of fabric and batting used from your stash. You can give them to Karen Shaffer at the monthly Sewcials or mail your squares to: MPQG, Attn: De-stash, PO Box 1025, Pacific Grove, CA 93950.

If you don't have time to donate squares, let us know how many yards you de-stashed and we will add squares for you. If you have any questions or need help calculating yardage, please contact Alisa Boehme at 650 862 7892 (text/voice) or alisaboehme@hotmail.com.

And, it's being given a slight facelift so that it will be appealing to Old Timers as well as Quilting Newbies.

The basic Improve Sticks has been a BOM several times over the years. It will still be a fun learning experience for Newbies. What will make it interesting to Old Timers is the optional addition of Sashiko, embroidery, or fancy machine stitches to a small segment created by the black & white "sticks."

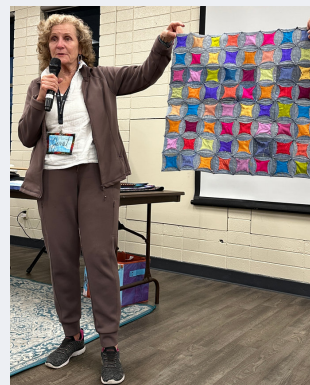

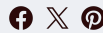
