I show images of my homes and quilts, and the people and places that influenced them. The process of quilt making is enormously important to me and I track various works in progress in my studio, as well as discuss how changes around me have affected and influenced my work. Also included are images of artists whose work I admire from around the world in places I have visited. I think this provides a close look at the working artist and teacher, where it all comes from, what makes me laugh, what the challenges are, and where I hope to go with it.... and that always changes, so come and enjoy my journey with me as I reflect on what it means to be an Itinerant Quilter.

Garage Sale Guidelines

THE BIG PICTURE

- 1. Open to all sewing related items IN GOOD CONDITION
- 2. NO ODORS IN FABRIC (fresh, not musty, smelling of laundry products or smoke)
- 3. NO LOOSE FABRIC, ONLY FABRIC THAT IS:
 - measured (mark on tape)
 - rolled and taped (blue painter's tape)
 - fat quarters taped singly or in a stack
 - quart sized zip-lock bags of scraps STAPLED SHUT
- 4. Anything smaller than 1/4 yd. should go into a zip-lock scrap bag.

MEASURING AND ROLLING

- 1. One fabric per roll.
- 2. Use a zip-lock bag if there are many pieces of the same fabric
- 3. One piece folded selvage to selvage:
 - measure along selvage to the nearest complete increment yardage. If there is just a bit left describe it: _______ + yds.
 - If there is a lot left, fold it over to meet the rest and guess the total.
 - Examples of one piece measured along selvage could be described as:
 - Fat quarter + (20" X 22" for instance)
 - 2 1/2 + (if it isn't quite 2 3/4)
- 4. Fabric that measures 2 yards or more may be folded instead of rolled. Please measure and roll around bolt board. Use blue painters tape and wrap completely around to secure. Mark length and pull out the board. These will go on the "flat fold" table. Measure and roll around a bolt board. Use blue painters tape and wrap completely.
- 5. Panel designs and similar pieces will be hung, so they can be turned in loose
- 6. Co-ordinating fabric pieces can be put into zip-lock bags and stapled shut.

TURNING IN FABRIC

A little extra effort on our part will make the Garage Sale a clean and welcoming environment. You MAY NOT turn in fabric rolls at general guild meetings. DO NOT turn in any loose fabric, it will be thrown out. Honestly.

Turn in prepared fabric and other items at Chautauqua Hall in Pacific Grove at 16th and Central any time during the day of set up.

Block of the Month: March 2019 * Wonky Star *



Well, when you were looking for bird fabric last month, did you find other animals or some Tula Pink (who hides animals in her prints) fabric that you forgot about? So, let's continue with a fussy cut center block. If you have Tula Pink fabric in your stash with a hidden animal, use it. Otherwise, choose another animal or a flower fabric, and solids for the star and a cream/off-white/light background.

Materials Needed

- (8) 3.5" squares in cream/off-white/light for background
- (1) 3.5" square for center fussy cut a Tula Pink animal, or other animal or a flower
- (4) 4" squares in 4 different solid or reads-solid colors to coordinate with center square for star points

Note: All seams are 1/4" unless noted otherwise.

Instructions

- 1. Starch the four star point squares to avoid bias stretch as they will be cut on the diagonal. The "stitch & flip" method will be used to create the star points.
- 2. Stack the four solid squares on top of each other and cut on the diagonal to create 8 triangles.
- 3. Take four background squares and four triangles. Stitch a triangle to the right side of a background square. (see pic 2, top 2) Changing the angle of the triangles will help create the wonky-ness of the star. (Make sure that when the triangle is flipped and pressed to the correct side, it extends past the edges of the background square.)
- 4. Flip the star point and press with a hot iron. Cut the excess background off.
- 5. Sew the remaining four triangles to the left side of these four background blocks (see pic 2, bottom 2) mixing up the colors and ensuring it extends past the edge of the 3.5" square. You can overlap the triangles slightly at the bottom, or leave a space. Each variation just adds to the wonky-ness.
- 6. Again, flip the star point and press with hot iron. Cut the excess background off.
- 7. Trim all four blocks to 3.5" squares by cutting off the excess.
- 8. Layout the block in final layout, and sew squares together in rows. Press seams to the solid squares. This will create nesting seams when sewing the rows together.
- 9. Press last two seams open. Finished block will measure 9.5" Square.





Remember, we appreciate DIFFERENT blocks. So if you make multiple blocks, please use different fabrics. This BOM is due at the guild meeting on **March 4, 2019**. More info on the BOM at www.mpqg.org/block-of-the-month.htm
