If you would like to be considered, please email Jeanne Mills by December 5, 2016.



These little quilts are fun and easy. If you use two layers of flannel you don't need any batting. If the top is quilting cotton, and the back flannel, use only a very light batting. Also, they can be tied or lightly quilted so they remain flexible. Thanks.

## Quilt Show Entry Form: Is this entry for sale?

Did you know that you must have written permission from the copyright holder in order to sell a quilt made from a copyrighted pattern? Most quilt patterns, whether published individually, in a book or magazine, or in electronic format, are protected by copyright. Only the copyright holder may profit from that pattern, or its derivative works, in any way. Check the copyright notice on the pattern; some explicitly grant permission for the sale of a quilt. If not, write and ask for permission; many quilt designers will gladly grant permission, as one of our members found out last year. When in doubt, either contact the copyright owner for written permission, or do not offer the quilt for sale.

Although we are a small local show, we need to respect the legal rights of designers, so whether or not you offer your quilt for sale, please be sure to credit the design source on your entry form. If the quilt is your original design, please list "original design" as the design source and feel free to offer it for sale.



#### Show Concept

We're very excited to announce a partnership between the MPQG and the Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History to create a special exhibition of quilts reflecting a theme of natural history collections. The show will open in January 2017 and run until April 2017.

The Pacific Grove Museum springs from travelers bringing in their collections from all over the world. The Museum is opening a small gallery to showcase some of these collections, and the Guild's quilt exhibition will complement the new gallery.

Our exhibition will feature quilts depicting different types of natural history collections --rocks, butterflies, leaves, feathers, birds, sea glass, fish, shells, whales, native plants-- the possibilities are endless.

#### Deadline

- Bring quilts with entry forms to the January 2, 2017 MPQG Members meeting.
- Quilts will be returned at the April 3, 2017 MPQG members meeting

#### Guidelines

1. Must be a member of the Monterey Peninsula Quilters Guild to enter – to join or renew your membership, visit [www.mpqg.org](http://www.mpqg.org).
2. Members may submit up to **three quilts** for the exhibition.
3. Complete an entry form for each quilt. - see page 10
4. Members may submit existing work that fits the theme and size or create something new.
5. Quilts may be any size up to 24 inches by 24 inches.
6. Each entry must be accompanied by a 4"x 5" photo of the quilt printed on glossy paper.
7. Each quilt must have a sleeve for hanging.
8. Each quilt must have a label identifying the quilter on the back of the quilt.
9. PG Museum staff will make the final selection of quilts to be exhibited.

NOTE: Although every protection is taken to safeguard your entry, MPQG does not provide property insurance. Please make sure your entries are covered under your homeowners insurance.

## What Password?

Our new website is dandy ... well, except for a few things like Passwords.

If you would like access to the members only areas which include the **ABOUT > Member Directory, > Financials**, and **> Pines & Needles Newsletters**, you'll need to spend 5 seconds dealing with the "sign in" feature. Here's how it works when you see the sign in screen. Just enter:

Username: your email

Password: quilt (note the lower case "q")

That password is generic for everyone in the guild until you have me change it for you. Why should you change it? Security. We're no different than the other websites you log on to these days. You will need:

- at least 8 characters -- the longer the better
- at least one alpha
- at least one numeric
- at least one non alphanumeric character

My suggestion is that you use your favorite password that meets the above criteria. For instance, it might look like this: ccs123CCS%. That would be easy for me to remember since those are my initials, and it has a nice rhythm to it. NOW, (1) write down your new password on that sheet of paper you keep next to your computer, and (2) send me an email with your new password and I'll enter it into the system. No one in the guild can see your password except for me ... very briefly. As soon as I enter "Save" it disappears.

A word about the user name. If you have a favorite user name other than your email address, you may change that also.

BTW - "quilt" will be expiring early next year, so beat the rush and let me know now what password you'd like to use. I'll bring a pad of paper to the next few meetings. Or, email me at [especials@sbcglobal.net](mailto:especials@sbcglobal.net).
