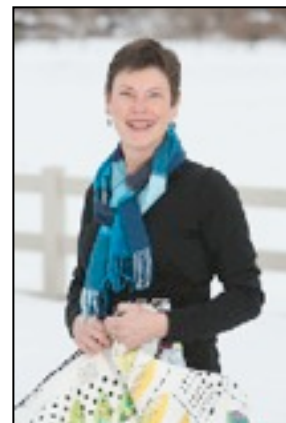

Join Piece O' Cake designer and quilter, Becky Goldsmith, to learn her *One Day Chirp - Appliqué With Attitude*. You'll learn to appliqué with attitude the Piece O' Cake way creating a whimsical bird on a 10" x 10" mini quilt.

Your stitches not only hold the appliqué in place, they embellish as well. The edge of the appliqué is needle-turned and sewn with perle cotton. The method is fast, fun and very cute. Three different stitches will be covered in this class which is suitable for all skill levels. Pattern included.

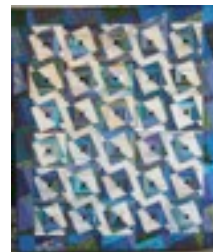

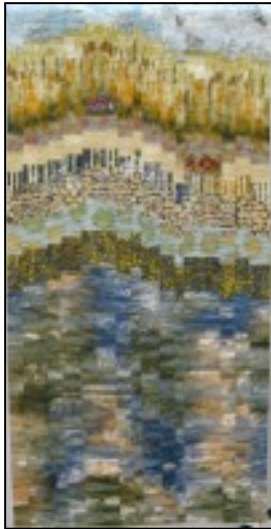
She reads a lot, tries to keep up at the gym and travels often with Art. "He is used to visiting quilt shops as part of the itinerary."

Two dates to remember: October 6 and Halloween.



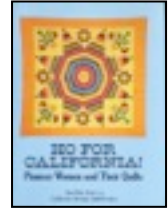
On October 6, the Pacific Grove Heritage Society is hosting an open house at the Pt. Pinos Lighthouse in Pacific Grove, CA. While there, be sure to buy a raffle ticket for a chance to win a Gail Abeloe or Phyllis Cullen art quilt. Both artists' work are part of the fundraising effort to support the ongoing renovations. October 31 (Halloween) - that's the day that the winning tickets will be drawn for Old Point Loma by award-winning fiber artist, Phyllis Cullen and local favorite, **Gail Abeloe**. Gail was inspired by a photograph from the collection of MPQG member, Genie Santini. She created *Point Pinos Lighthouse Circa 1890* as a reminder of the bison that roamed. Here's the story:

Bovine and bison browse leisurely on spring grass near the Piney Paradise. In 1890, the Pacific Improvement Company tried breeding buffalo and Galloway cattle for "Catalo" at Pebble Beach. The idea was to crossbreed for high quality pelts and a good grade of meat. When the experiment failed, the buffalo roamed. The animals were fond of swimming around Point Pinos and wandering through the Grove. Eventually, the Pacific Improvement Company caught and donated the beasts to San Francisco's Golden Gate Park, where their progeny can be seen to this day.

Library Highlights: Jean Ray Laury

Kay Scannell has agreed to share the comments on her quilt from Judge, Jody Ohrt, MPQG 2013 quilt show judge.

Kay's quilt entitled "Beautiful Hawaii" was quilted by Holly Casey and entered into competition in the Top By One, Quilted by Another category. She was awarded honorable mention in this large category.

Notes from the judge:

- Excellent example of Hawaiian applique
- Sashing Choice unifies block
- All applique curves should be smooth
- All edges should be secure
- Applique stitch is well accomplished
- All sashing pieces should be aligned
- Echo quilting is appropriate to Hawaiian design
- Rayon thread is good choice
- Quilting technique is good
- Hand binding technique needs improvement
- Backing fabric displays quilting well

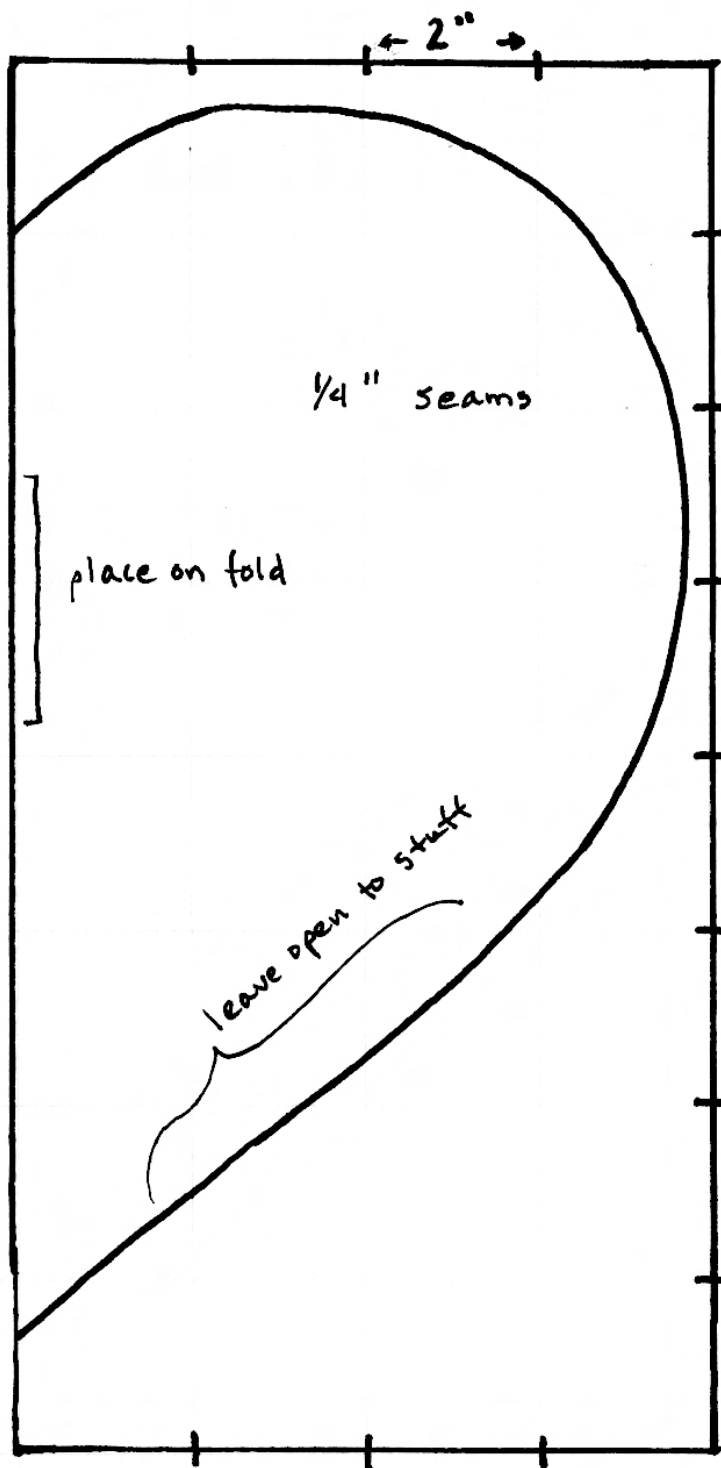

Collecting New York Beauty Quilts: Bill Volckening's Passion

Collecting New York Beauty Quilts: Bill Volckening's Passion focuses on the evolution of a unique quilt pattern—New York Beauty—and shows its many variations and modifications throughout the nineteenth to twenty-first centuries. Comprised of approximately 35 objects (including quilts, ephemera, patterns, books, and a woven coverlet), the exhibition is centered on the New York Beauty pattern. Now over 150 years later, the New York Beauty still resonates with contemporary quilters and artists as they continue to use the challenging design paired with new fabrics to create updated versions. The graphic quality and visual appeal of these quilts will inspire visitors as will Volckening's unique perspective and passion for collecting these amazing textiles.

Tasty! Food Inspired Quilts

Tasty! Food Inspired Quilts offers a whimsical exploration into the intersection of some of our most basic needs: food, warmth, and community. The show will engage with other local organizations and community-wide projects surrounding the Around the Table Food Festival coming to San Jose this fall. Among the quilts to be featured in Tasty! is a gigantic, lifelike tortilla quilt by San Jose artist Yolanda Guerra, created from her original design of tortilla fabric. This toasty crust looks good enough to eat. In a 16-panel quilt on loan from History San Jose, each panel features a different fruit from the famous orchards of the Santa Clara Valley. Also featured are quilts from the museum's own collection that speak to the theme of local food, and a psychedelic burger quilt by legendary California quilter Yvonne Porcella.

Out of Chaos

Featured in the newly named "Yvonne's Place" gallery, will be a group of stunning asymmetrical quilts by Linda Toeniskoetter. Out of Chaos showcases her novel approach to design and variation on traditional pieced blocks. These quirky geometric combinations of pattern create lively movement throughout the quilts, and the uneven edges are unusual, almost a bit unsettling. The quilts reflect a personal story of survival and show the power of artistic expression, innovation, and healing that results while creating a body of work. Behind the jewel-toned and dynamic chaos is a rich and intimate outpouring of unique work – "the building of a quilt lets me experience this process of creating balance as an example for the rest of my life," she says. Toeniskoetter's work has been shown nationally.
