Julie McLeod Rescue Me!

Julia McLeod is an international award-winning guilt maker living and working in Northern California.

Born and raised in England, she worked as a textile designer in the woolen and worsted mills of Yorkshire and Scotland before taking a job with a luxury tailoring company on



London's Savile Row. A design position at a menswear company in New York City brought her to the US, and she's been here ever since. She discovered quilt making on travels through the small Amish towns of Pennsylvania. Some of the first guilts she made were for her young children.

Since 2016 Julia has specialized in making silk quilts, sourcing her fabrics from neckties, clothing and furnishing fabrics. She has a passion for reuse and recycling, which leads her to rescue vintage blocks and textiles. These reclaimed fabrics become the starting point for her quilt designs.

In this lecture, Julia will demonstrate with several projects from rescued materials through to finished guilts and teach about the techniques she used to tame unusual fabrics.

March Workshop – Zoom

Starting with Silk

Workshop with Julie McLeod

Saturdays – March 11 & 18, 2023 9am to 12pm via ZOOM

In this 6-hour workshop you will learn how to use silk fabrics in your quiltmaking. We will:

- Identify silk fabrics and distinguish them from those made with other fibers by using the burn test
- Discuss fusible stabilizers and how to use them
- Learn an improvisational crazy-piecing method
- · Learn fabric foundation piecing. We will draft simple muslin foundations

There are two different ways to work with silk in quilting. First, *Pieces, Pairs and Panels* is a very free, improvisation piecing technique. Second, foundation piecing gives stability and ultra-precise results, even with the lightest weight silks.

Working with your stash, you'll construct elements in these two techniques that can be combined into a small, pillow-sized finished piece.

Workshop with Tara Faughnan

Tara Faughnan is known for use of color and complex color interaction in her quilts. The Give and Take quilt is an exercise in controlled improvisation. This method of practicing improv within the block and then squaring it up for final construction allows room for a lot of play and exploration both in color and form. We will also discuss how color placement and value can create high impact compositions that moves the eye across the quilt.


The Pillow Projects


Dear Friends,

I am OUT of port pillows! Besides supplying SVMH, CHOMP would like some! I am ordering more Velcro and will have it at the March meeting as well as stuffing, which I have lots of!

I have a small supply of heart pillows that need to be stuffed but I can always use more. Kathleen Clancy, my predecessor, dropped off a pile of amazing red satin heart pillows at CHOMP for Valentine's Day and they went quickly. The heart pillows can be either pieced or cut from pretty fabric. You can stuff to a medium firmness or I can do it for you.

The port pillows are made from 2 - 4" x7" pieces of fabric and 7" of 1/2" or 3/4" Velcro (cut in half) and stuffing.



Block of the Month – March 2023



Milkmaid's Star

The Milkmaid's Star "block pattern dates from 1948, when it was published by *The Kansas City Star* newspaper. *Quilters Newsletter Magazine* included it in the March 1983 issue's collection of blocks that paid tribute to the dairy state of Wisconsin." With just four easy to assemble parts, this block is quick to assemble. Our blocks are 12". Put four 6" blocks together for a magical effect. "Use coordinating contemporary fabrics for a sophisticated effect or go scrappy for a vintage look." Most of the above was directly quoted from <u>Quilters Newsletter</u>, *Best Blocks* publication.

ALPHABET SOUP

18" x 18"

3 layers (top, batting and backing), a sleeve for hanging and a label*. Quilt must contain one letter of the alphabet, big or small. Any style, technique, or color you want.

Your quilt should represent one of the 26 letters of the alphabet. Some ideas include:

- Choosing a traditional or modern quilt block that begins in the letter of choice (i.e., B = Bear's Paw, Basket, etc.)
 - Embellishing quilt with things pertaining to the letter of choice (i.e., B= buttons, beads, etc.)
 - Appliquéing animals or objects onto the block (i.e., B=bear, butterfly, etc.)
 - Foundation paper piece the letter of choice
 - A combination of all the above.

We hope you will participate in this year's challenge, it's so much fun to see how creative a group we are.

The quilts will be due at our guild meeting on Aug 1, 2023.

Definitions for Quilt Judging Categories

- **Traditional Quilts:** Based on a traditional design, pieced and/or appliquéd; includes English paper piecing and foundation piecing (on paper or fabric) Hand-quilted quilts *MUST* be **entirely** hand-quilted
- **Top by One, Quilted by Another:** The quilt top has been completed by one person, and the quilting was done by someone else. A kit quilt quilted by someone other than the maker of the quilt top is not eligible for judging.
- **Special Quilt Techniques:** Includes construction methods such as fusing and digital printing, surface design techniques and embellishments such as thread painting, beading, crystals, embroidery, and painting, or a mixture of hand and machine quilting; includes tied quilts, as well as any quilt that does not obviously fit into any other category
- Group Quilt: A quilt with a top which has been completed by two or more persons.
- **Kit Quilt:** A quilt made by using, and perhaps altering somewhat, a kit which includes the pattern and pre-selected fabric, thereby collaborating with the author of the pattern and the maker of the kit. The quilt shall otherwise be entirely completed by the maker, including the quilting. A kit quilt not quilted by the maker of the quilt top is not eligible for judging. A kit quilt will not be eligible for Best of Show.
- **Modern Quilts:** Usually functional, simplistic and minimalist, often with bold colors and prints, high contrast, asymmetric design, improvisational piecing, expansive negative space and alternate grid work

Art Quilts: Completely **original** design meant to be hung as a work of art. Any source material must be the original work of the maker, *including photos*.

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1. A quilt might seem to fit in several categories, but please choose the category you believe best fits your quilt.
- 2. The Preview Committee will also be assessing the photo for appropriate category and may call you concerning the chosen category if a question **arises**.

MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL: Only the first one hundred entries for Judging will be accepted, so submit your entries EARLY! Don't wait for the March 6 deadline!
