The entry information has been entered into the database by **Sharon Winter** and the photos and information passed along to the quilt show designer, **Kathrin Brown**, who will decide where to place your beautiful quilts.



Once *Kathrin* has finished the design process, the acceptance letters will be mailed out and you should be receiving yours in early April. Please open your letter immediately upon receipt and correct any errors you may find by contacting *Sharon Winter*, 831-647-8769 or slwinterNL@comcast.net.

The letter will include instructions that you need to follow and a paper label that needs to be <u>sewn</u> to the back of the quilt before turning it in. It will also contain instructions for making and attaching a sleeve for hanging your quilt.

All quilts <u>must</u> have a hanging sleeve! If you have any questions about anything in the acceptance letter or labels, or you have not received your letter by April 12th, please contact *Sharon Winter*. The quilt turn-in date is <u>Thursday</u>, <u>May 2nd</u> at Chautauqua Hall from 7:30 AM - 9:30 AM. The deadline for judged quilts is 8:30 AM.

If, for any reason, you know that you will not be able to complete your quilt in time for the show contact *Kathrin Brown* as soon as possible: kathrin.brown@gmail.com. Do not wait until the day before the show, please. Happy Quilting!





Editor's Row

I've learned so much about our guild since becoming the newsletter editor and one of the (many) things that just amazes me is the volume of quilts our members make and donate to the **Community Outreach** program. I asked the outreach team for some actual numbers because I am writing up publicity for our quilt show and want to share that information with the news outlets, to give them some idea of how much *MPQG* contributes to our community. Now that I have this info, I just have to share it with you!

Fatima Dias handles Dialysis, Tummy Time, and CASA Teen quilts. She also helped with that huge delivery of twin quilts to the Shuman HeartHouse. Each group of quilts has its own size guidelines. Fatima reports deliveries in the last year of 26 to US Renal, 46 to CASA, 7 to Family Support at Salinas Elementary and 6 to MPUSD Family Outreach; a total of 87 twin and/or lap size to Community Human Services, and 36 tummy time quilts to Natividad and Monterey County Public Health, which doesn't include those distributed in Santa Cruz County. "My philosophy has been that if someone took the time to make and donate a quilt, my job is to get it into the hands of someone who will use and, hopefully, cherish it."

Marcia Givvin is in charge of Heart and Port Pillows. Approximately 26 heart comfort pillows and 35 port pillows have been donated since January 1st of this year (plus 40 lavender eye masks). "It means so much to our recipients. They are receiving something very useful and made by someone who cares."

Liz Rondelle takes care of NICU and Overlay quilts. She delivers to three hospitals mid-month: Salinas Valley and Natividad each get two overlay quilts and five to six small quilts, and CHOMP gets three to four small quilts every month.

Carole Brower delivers about 10 Wheelchair Lap quilts every 2-3 months. Carole says it has been slow going with all the larger projects the Community Outreach committee is doing. The lap quilt project started in October of 2023 and deliveries go to VNA Hospice of the Central Coast for Monterey County.

Wow! That is pure awesomeness!! So much love and care sent out into our community. Thank you to all the generous quilt makers and everyone giving and sharing their time and talents. Kudos to you all! I'm proud to belong to such a giving, caring organization.
