Korean-born artist Youngmin Lee holds a master's degree in fashion design and a bachelor's degree in clothing and textiles. A textile artist, Youngmin uses bojagi tradition and techniques to create her work. She has researched bojagi making and techniques and endeavors to apply her findings to both traditional and contemporary art. She actively works on preserving the bojagi tradition that



embodies the philosophy of recycling and up-cycling, as the works are made from pieces of fabric leftover from other projects. Youngmin created the DVD, *Bojagi: The Art of Wrapping Cloths* in 2013. Youngmin's works have been exhibited and collected throughout the United States and internationally.

September Workshop – Zoom



Jogakbo with Ssamsol Technique

Workshop with Youngmin Lee

Saturday, September 16, 2023 1pm to 4pm via ZOOM

Youngmin Lee is Korean-born with a master's degree in fashion design and bachelor's in clothing and textiles. In this class she will be teaching the Korean art of patchwork Jogakbo with the Ssmasol technique.

Patchwork bojagi, or **Jogakbo**, are used as Korean wrapping cloths and used in everyday Korean culture. With thoughtfully arranged shapes and colors, bojagi creates a modern and abstract composition.

Ssamsol is a durable and decorative seam technique where you use two different seam allowances. One seam allowance is twice the width of the other one, so it can cover the smaller seam allowance. (Think French seams.) Using this Ssamsol technique, Youngmin will teach 'Ssamsol Jogakbo' construction to create your own unique piece.

A material kit will be available to purchase from Youngmin at the September 11 guild meeting (\$30) or from her website (+\$5 for shipping) <u>www.youngminlee.com</u>. Kit includes assorted fabric pieces, thread, needle and PDF instructions.

Community Outreach Challenge!!!

Several weeks ago Fatima Dias was contacted by **Shuman HeartHouse Shelter** which is a low barrier emergency shelter for single women and families with children. Operated by Community Human Services, the shelter is located in Monterey and is scheduled to open by early December. Guests can stay for 90 days with a possibility of up to six months (with justification). Case Managers will provide services around housing, employment, education and more to help guests access and sustain dependable housing.

Each woman will have her own "carrel" – a private space with their bed within a larger room – for the duration of their stay. In addition, there are four family rooms to accommodate families of various sizes. **Our Guild has agreed to help create a homey atmosphere by donating 35 twin bed size quilts, 63" x 87**".

Block of the Month – September 2023



HANGING BASKET

The September Block is the twelfth and final block in our series. Every quilter needs at least one basket in their repertoire. Found in <u>Best Blocks</u> by "Quilters Newsletter", Hanging Basket is a little different than most basket blocks. "Attributed to Clara Stone in her Practical Needlework: Quilt Patterns, it was presented as Mrs. Hardy's Hanging Basket and was republished by The Kansas City Star in 1937 as Hanging Basket."

While it might be faster and even a bit easier to use traditional piecing, I will once again be presenting our block for Foundation Paper Piecing (FPP). With so many angles to deal with, FPP will keep our block perfectly square.

Find the pattern and instructions on the Guild <u>website</u> a few days to a week after the Newsletter arrives.

There will be no Block of the Month ZOOM in September, but I am happy to answer any questions.


