
David Owen Hastings Exploring Nature with Paper & Stitch



Our Guild's Community Outreach continues to send a message of warmth, safety and love.

After taking a brief holiday pause from making and delivering lots of quilts & heart/port pillows we are making preparations for 2024 and are excited for our return to inperson meetings in March. Currently, our primary needs for upcoming deliveries to our various recipients are listed below:







NICU Questions and Answers:

Q: Can I heavily quilt a NICU quilt?

A: Yes, for the overlay quilts 45" x 45". No for the small 20" x 24". If densely quilted, they are not as soft as they need to be. Machine quilting such as stitch in the ditch or some other spaced quilting is best.

Q: Does an overlay quilt have to be 45 " x 45"? A: It seems that fabric widths are shrinking; 43 inches and even 42 inches wide are now the norm. We understand that you don't want to add a 2" or 3" inch border, so we are accepting quilts that are a few inches short.

- You may enter up to three (3) quilts to be judged that have been finished in the last three years (this includes challenge quilts). There is a **\$10 per quilt fee** for judging.
- A 4" x 6" photo must be attached to each

Ribbons: First, second, and third place and honorable mention MAY be awarded at the discretion of the judge; Best of Show – 1; Judge's Choice - 1 ribbon per judge; Youth Awards - as appropriate

Definitions for Quilt Judging Categories

Traditional Quilts: Based on a traditional design, pieced and/or appliquéd; includes English paper piecing and foundation piecing (on paper or fabric). Hand-quilted quilts *MUST* be **entirely** hand-quilted

Top by One, Quilted by Another: The quilt top has been completed by one person, and the quilting was done by someone else. A kit quilt quilted by someone other than the maker of the quilt top is not eligible for judging.

Special Quilt Techniques: Includes construction methods such as fusing and digital printing, surface design techniques and embellishments such as thread painting, beading, crystals, embroidery, and painting, or a mixture of hand and machine quilting; includes tied quilts, as well as any quilt that does not obviously fit into any other category

Group Quilt: A quilt with a top which has been completed by two or more persons.

Kit Quilt: A quilt made by using, and perhaps altering somewhat, a kit which includes the pattern and pre-selected fabric, thereby collaborating with the author of the pattern and the maker of the kit. The quilt shall otherwise be entirely completed by the maker, including the quilting. A kit quilt not quilted by the maker of the quilt top is not eligible for judging. A kit quilt will not be eligible for Best of Show.

Modern Quilts: Usually functional, simplistic and minimalist, often with bold colors and prints, high contrast, asymmetric design, improvisational piecing, expansive negative space and alternate grid work

Art Quilts, Original: COMPLETELY original design meant to be hung as a work of art. Any source material must be the original work of the maker, *including photos*.

Art Quilts, Non-Original Source: An original design meant to be hung as a work of art, with the source material (such as photos) <u>not</u> original to the maker. Maker must have written permission from the copyright holder of the source material, where applicable.

PLEASE NOTE:

- 1. A quilt might seem to fit in several categories, but please choose the category you believe best fits your quilt.
